### Dress for the Weather

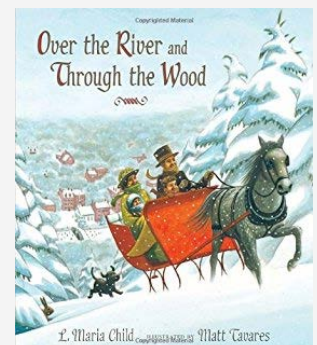
Students go out for recess daily. Please be sure your child has the appropriate outdoor gear that will keep him/her warm and dry.

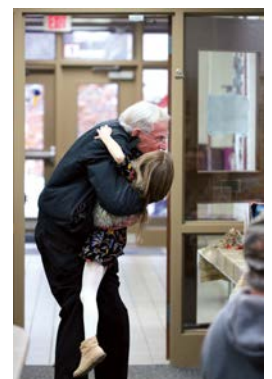
### Christmas Program
