

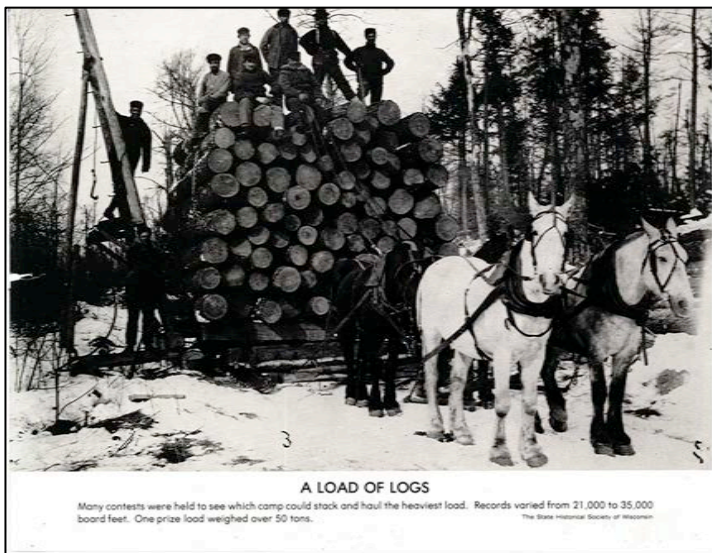

Food Drive

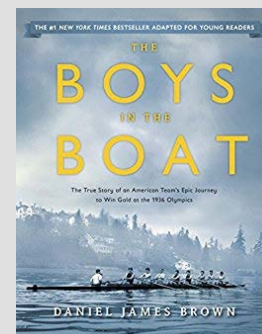

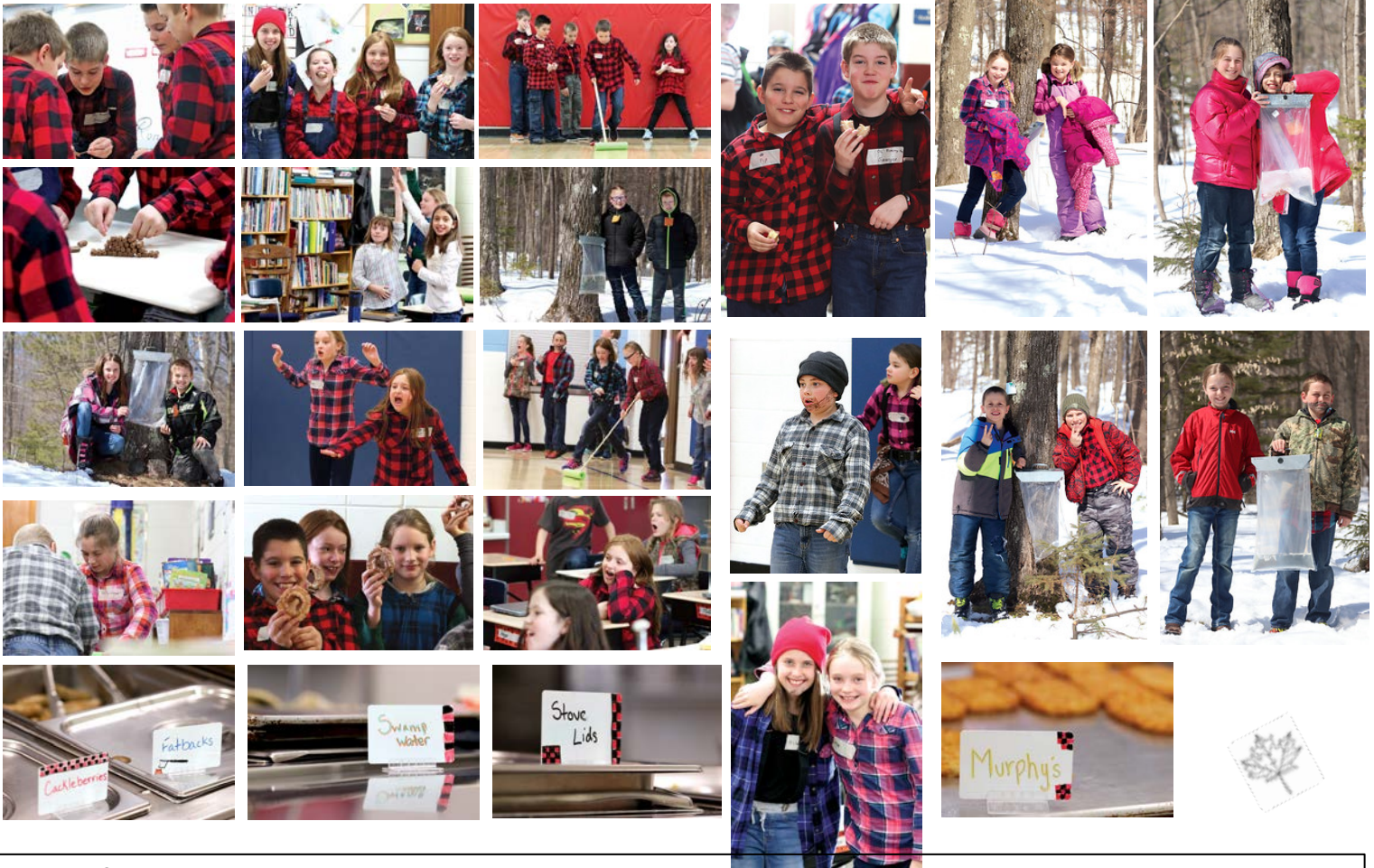
Spring Time!
