

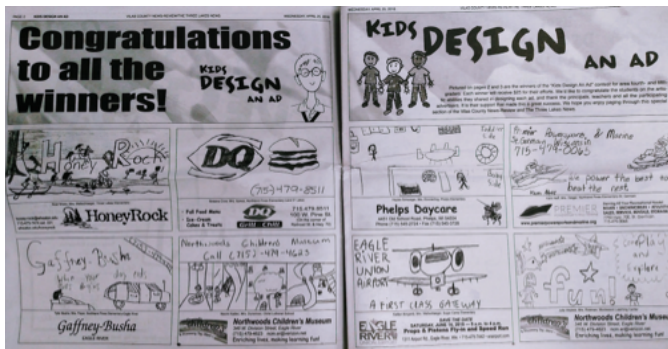

Tech Update: Chromebook Filter Changes

Three Lakes School District is implementing a new application that allows continuous filtering of school Chromebooks, whether they're used at school or off-site. The means website restrictions at school will also be in place wherever students use their Chromebooks. Students in grades 5-12 are issued Chromebooks each year. While schools have always been required to filter objectionable content on the school network for student safety, this approach is specific to the device rather than the location. These devices are provided for school-related use, and the sites allowed on them reflect that. Although this filter adds another layer of safety, keep in mind that nothing is totally effective so please continue to monitor your son's or daughter's technology use at home. As always, feel free to contact the District with questions or concerns.

Lunch - \$2.75 (\$.40 reduced)
