Speeches

The 5th and 6th graders at Sugar Camp Elementary have been working very hard over the past six weeks putting together their conservation speeches. As many of you know, this is an annual event at Sugar Camp School. Students first compete at the classroom level. If speeches are selected to move on, they will compete at the school-wide level, and then the county level of competition. The competition is sponsored by the WI Land and Water Conservation Association.

All speeches must adhere to the following guidelines:

- Topics must be local, current, and conservation related.
- Speeches must be 3-5 minutes in length.
- The use of notecards is allowed, but no other props.

Speeches are judged on the content (45%), the delivery (45%) and style (10%). All fifth- and sixth-graders presented their speeches to the first round of judges in their classrooms last week. Students who spoke today at the school-wide competition include:


Early Release Day

From the Library Shelf...


