Poster Contest

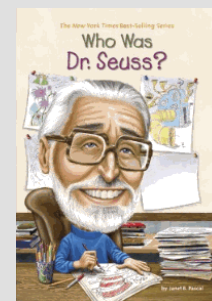

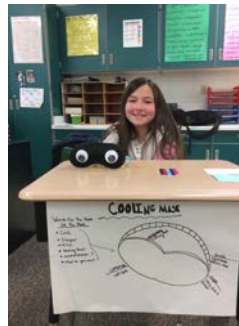
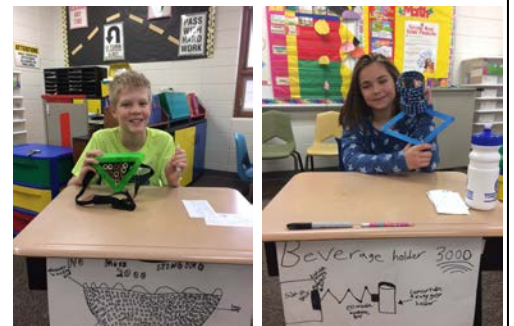

Invention Convention 2018!

On February 23, fifth-grade students presented their inventions at the **Invention Convention**. This project is a culmination of a thematic unit: matter and energy in science, What's The Big Idea? in reading, inventor report writing in language, and even electrifying spelling words for their spelling unit. The project consisted of three main parts (the invention blue prints, the actual construction of the invention, and a commercial to sell their invention).

For the invention portion of the project, students had to invent a completely new product or one that would improve upon an existing item; draw a labeled diagram (blueprint); create a model of, or the actual invention; and present the invention at the convention. For the commercial portion, students completed a commercial plan including: slogan, actual cost to make their invention, a selling price, targeted consumers, and selling points/sales pitch. Then they had to write, edit, memorize, and record their commercials using Photo Booth. Finally, they designed their commercial card using a Power Point presentation. Students are always so creative and come up with amazing commercials and inventions!
