

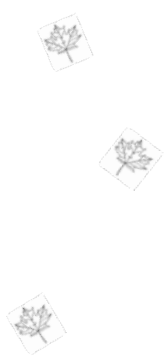

Battle of the Books

At the end of each school year all students entering grades 4-6 the following fall are given a list of approximately 50 books. They are encouraged to read as many books as possible over the summer and throughout the school year. In early April, classrooms then hold a competition to select battle team members. Each battle team is comprised of one 4th grader, one 5th grader, and one 6th grader. As a team, they try and complete the list of books and study titles and authors of the books. A school wide competition is held amongst these teams and the winning team represents Sugar Camp School in the regional battle.

The regional Battle of the Books was held on May 2 in Three Lakes. There were four teams that competed: Three Lakes, Sugar Camp, Elcho, and Phelps. Each team competed in at least two rounds of play in which they tried to accumulate as many points as possible. Teams accumulate points by answering questions about the books. They have to give the correct title, exactly as it appears on the list, earning them 5 points. If they can also identify the correct author, they can earn an additional 3 points. After the first two rounds of play, the two teams that have earned the most points compete in a championship round. During the championship round, students can steal points if their opponent does not correctly answer a question. Phelps and Sugar Camp both earned their way into the championship round. After a long fought battle, Sugar Camp took 2nd place and Phelps was crowned the 2018 Battle of the Books Champions! Congratulations to all who participated! Keep reading!

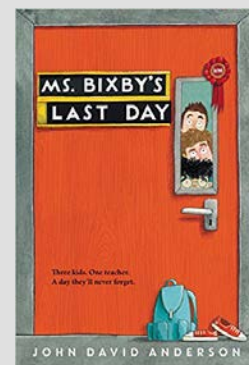
March Madness of a Different Kind
