The final meeting of the SCO will be on Sunday, May 20. It will take place at Moondance starting at 6 p.m. All are welcome to attend.

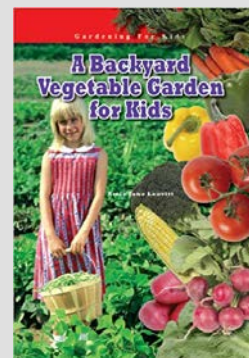
## Awards Day/Activity Day
