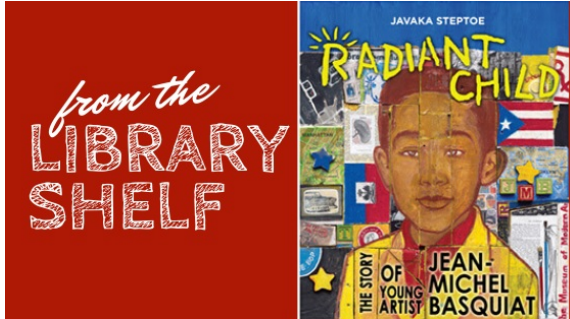


Let's Celebrate All Things Seuss!
